22. Talking about the difference between a conventional behaviour and a moral behaviour, Gandhiji says that moral act must be our own act which must spring from our own will. We should bear in mind the distinction between acting mechanically and acting intentionally.

When we all care only for what or <u>conscience</u> says, then alone can we be regarded to have stepped on to the moral road. We should believe that God is within us, the God of all, is the ever present witness to all our acts.

The moral action depends upon the <u>intention</u> of the doer. For instance, a man out of great pity feeds the poor and another who does the same with the motive of winning prestige or with some such selfish end. Though the action is the same, the act of one is moral and that of other non-moral.

It is not enough for a moral act to have been done with a good intention, but it should have been done <u>without compulsion</u>.

Just as a moral action should be free from fear or compulsion so should there be no <u>self-interest</u> behind it.

Action done for considerations of comfort and personal happiness is non-moral. That action is moral which is done only for the sake of doing good.

It is cowardice to be true to friends and break faith with enemies. Those who do good out of fear and haltingly have no moral virtue.

OR

Adolf Hitler, in 1933 began issuing anti-Jewish decrees which made all the Jews in Germany to either migrate to other places or go in hiding. People hid in dark and airless rooms without proper food or ventilation. When they were arrested by the Nazi police, they were taken to the Nazi concentration camps and tortured to death. The Nazi had no compassion for women and children too. Families were split with men somewhere and their women and children elsewhere. They were kept in very pathetic conditions without proper food or attire. In fact children were made to stand naked in freezing rain before being sent to the gas chamber. After the prisoners died, they were all dumped and buried together in mass graves. Thus the Nazis treated the Jews with utmost cruelty and barbarism.

He expresses his grief, for his mother cannot see him grown-up and cannot see how his son has lived his life. He says that even if death could be undone and his mother be reincarnated it would be of no use because they would not recognize each other. He then thinks that she is in the suffering they need to undergo while bearing the child and when in labour. He concludes the poem with more feeling of guilt for he thinks he has not repaid the favour of living upto his mother's desires and to that of women in general. The poet thinks that being a man, he is also to be blamed for the fact that men are considered superior to women for he has not done anything about it. He expresses concern over the inequality of gender. The tone of the poem is serious and grave and makes us think about the way we treat women in our society.

- a) India is a democratic country where the parliamentary system of government prevails. So every individual is expected to know the functioning of this system. The members of the parliament are elected by voting. Therefore school is the avenue where children, the future citizens can be taught the values and methods of voting.

Generally almost all higher primary schools do adopt the system of conducting elections to choose student leaders at school level and class level. Soon after the schools reopen in June every year, elections are held to form the School Parliament. In schools, class leaders are elected to form the parliament. From among them, the various office bearers such as Chairman, School leaders etc are elected. The school leader will be the Chief Minister. The Chief Minister nominates the other members of the cabinet and they are given different portfolios. Discipline, sanitation, running of library and reading rooms, social service and cultural activities are some of the portfolios entrusted to them. The headmaster of the school will be the president. Two or three sessions of school parliament will be conducted every year.

There are many advantages to the credit of school parliaments. The school parliament gives training to the students regarding the function of democracy. This helps the students understand the process of the parliamentary system of the government. In a broad sense, the school parliament teaches children how democracy works. They freely vote their favourite candidates. They learn that the group which gets the majority assumes power. Leadership qualities are spotted and developed. Children learn to be responsible. School parliament are entrusted with the discipline, cleanliness and running of class rooms and libraries. Those entrusted with such responsibilities will become good administrators later. The success of democracy in our country depends to a great extent on the effective functioning of school parliaments.

b) Water is precious – save it: Water is an essential part of all life on the globe. Plant and animal cannot not live without water. Water ensures food security, livestock security, maintain organic life, industrial production and to conserve the biodiversity and environment. Hence, there could be no life without water. Earth is the only planet, so far we know that posses water and this makes it fit for human living and other living organisms to exist on it.

This precious substance which is not properly utilized by mankind and increasing demand due to growing population and unsuitable lifestyle, many countries are facing sever water crisis.
